Melinda Fischer, Head Softball Coach

Head Coach Melinda Fischer, now in her 34th season at the helm of the highly successful Red-bird softball program, has established herself and the team in a league of their own. Fischer's 1,053 career victories, spread out among 34 previous seasons as a collegiate head coach rank her as the 17th-winningest coach in NCAA Division I softball history and the 10th-winningest active head coach. In 2017, Fischer became the 20th coach in NCAA Softball history to earn 1,000 wins at one school and only the 10th Division I coach reach this mark. A six-time MVC/Gateway Coach of the Year and a NFCA Hall of Fame inductee, Fischer proves that excellence is the rule, not the exception at Illinois State.



Tina Kramos, Associate Head Softball Coach

Senior Associate Head Coach Tina Kramos enters her 19th season with the Redbirds following a successful career as a player and coach. Primarily working with the Redbirds' hitters and outfielders, Kramos has coached three All-Americans and three MVC Players of the Year. On the field, Kramos competed in the 2004 Summer Olympics and the 2006 Women's Softball World Championship as a member of Greek National Team after her time as a two-time All-MVC First-Team selection at Missouri State. Also coaching the Greek National Softball Team in 2015, Kramos spent time at Colorado-Colorado Springs and Nicholls State before her current position with the Redbirds.



Tara Archibald, Assistant Softball Coach-Pitching

Tara Archibald is in her 2nd season at Illinois State, bringing 14 years of coaching experience at various levels as a former NCAA Scholar Athlete award winner at Southern Illinois and pitching coach at Georgia. Archibald comes from Field House Sports where she worked as the Sports Administrator and Lead Softball Instructor. She previously served as an assistant coach working primarily with pitchers at Georgia from 2011 to 2014. Prior to Georgia, Archibald served as a manager and coach of the Southern Force Softball Organization from 2003 to 2011 following her playing career at SIU where earn their first-ever NCAA Tournament win in 2003 en route to advancing to the school's first Sweet 16 appearance.
